Your Green Career is Our Future: Green Jobs Career Readiness for Young People

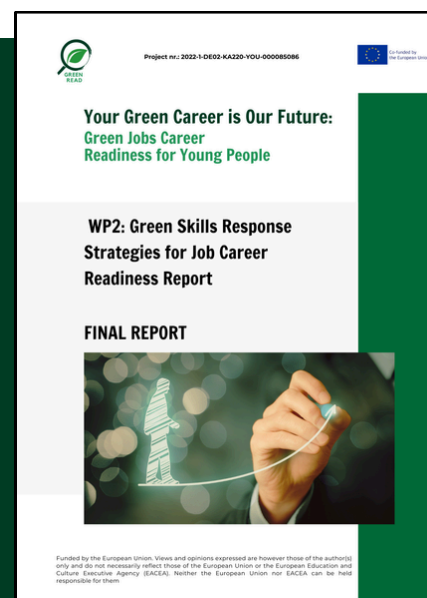
On 6th and 7th November 2023, The **GREEN READ** team met in Madrid, for the 2nd TPM, to check on project's progresses and decide on next steps.

The meeting celebrated the finalization of one of the main project's Result:

WP2 Green Skills Response Strategies for Job Career Readiness Report

The report illustrates the policies and initiatives on green jobs and green skills implemented in each partner country.

- To assess the skills training responses in environmental strategies and programmes for young people in YECs, VETS, TVETs and HE institutions.
- To explore their potential responses to environmentally-driven skills requirements for young people in YECs, VETS, TVETs and HE institutions.



During the meeting, we settled up the next steps of the project; in particular those concerning the development of **WP3** Digital Training Materials and Try Out Sessions.

The objectives of the Output are:

- provide digital training material to the YECs, VETs, TVETs and HEIs in order to prepare young people for green jobs career readiness.
- to validate the training materials with pilot testing in partner countries.



The partnership agreed on the identification of specific soft skills, which can be applied across many sectors and also to Green Jobs.

Those are:

- cognitive competencies
- inter-personal skills
- Intra-personal competencies

The training material will consist of a series of video lectures, one for each skill, with specific case studies matched to each skill identified.

The training, will be then assessed through a final questionnaire.
